Featuring 2MP front-facing camera, built-in microphone, speaker & headset support and versatile network capabilities of LAN, Wi-Fi and Bluetooth, the terminal not only provides multimedia entertainment for patients but also serves



as an ideal platform for patient-clinician communication. Optional NFC/RFID module helps to facilitate the ease of identity verification for access control and medical payment transactions. With regard of medical safety, the terminal meets the IEC60601-1 (Edition 3.1), EN60601-1 (Edition 3.1) and EN60601-1-2 (Edition 4th) medical regulations. 



Chapter 2

Getting Started

2.1 Getting to Know the Terminal

Before starting to use the terminal, get to know it first. This section will quickly familiarize you with the terminal.



No.	Item	Descriptions
1	Power button	Press-and-hold this key to power on/off the terminal. When the terminal is powered on, press this key to turn on/off the display.
2	Volume control	Press to increase/decrease volume
3	Front camera	2MP front-facing camera
4	Touch screen	A 10-point projected capacitive multi-touch screen allowing users to interact with the terminal without a mouse or keyboard.
5	Headset jack	Line-out. To connect to a headset.
6	Reset	Reset button (covered by a sheet metal) To reset the terminal, insert the end of a paperclip or similar object into the reset hole. Press and then release the button inside to reset the terminal.
7	OTG Micro USB port	On-The-Go (OTG) Micro USB port (covered by a sheet metal) To connect the terminal to a USB peripheral (through an OTG cable) or to a computer.
8	SD card slot	microSD/SDHC card slot (covered by a sheet metal) To insert a microSD/SDHC card.

9	Mic.	A built-in microphone to capture sound and voice when used with a program capable of recording audio.
10	Speaker	Integrated 3W stereo speakers for audio output.
11	USB port	USB 2.0 Type-A port. To connect to a USB device.
12	DC-IN jack	To connect to a power outlet using the provided power adapter.
		10/100M RJ-45 port with PoE support.
		To connect to a PoE power sourcing equipment (PSE), such as a switch or hub, to provide power to the terminal.
13	LAN port	As PoE provides both data and power connections in one Ethernet cable, the PoE connection eliminates the need for connecting the DC-IN jack to a power outlet.
		The RJ-45 connector comes with LED to indicate the power source:
		Green: Power is supplied from DC power jack.
		Orange: Power is supplied from PoE.
14	RFID/NFC	RFID/NFC reader (optional)
15	VESA	VESA-75 mounting holes

2.2 Installing the microSD/SDHC Card

The terminal supports microSD/SDHC card of up to 32GB. The microSD/SDHC card slot is on the bottom of the terminal covered by a sheet metal with torx screws. To install a microSD/SDHC card to the terminal:


1. Use a torx screwdriver to loosen and remove the screws securing the sheet metal.



2. Locate the microSD/SDHC card slot and insert your microSD/SDHC card. Firmly insert the card until it is all the way in. The card only fits one direction as shown below.



 To verify if the card is successfully inserted, tap the Settings icon on the home screen and then tap Device > Storage > SD card. If the SD card is successfully mounted, you should be able to find the SD card information.




4. Restore the sheet metal cover and secure it with the two torx screws.


2.3 Connecting USB Peripherals to the Terminal

The terminal comes with two USB ports for connection of USB peripherals (e.g., USB flash drive, keyboard, mouse, printer) to the terminal.

USB Type-A port: To use this port, simply connect the USB peripheral
to the USB port on the rear of the terminal. Tap Settings > Device >
Storage > USB Storage 2 and you should be able to find the USB device's
information.




OTG Micro USB port: Alternatively you can use this USB port in case
the one on the rear of the terminal has already been occupied. To use this
port, you will need an OTG cable (not included) to make the connection as
shown below.




2.4 Connecting the Terminal to a Computer

Using the OTG Micro USB port on the terminal, you can connect the terminal to a computer or laptop for data transferal and update. To do so:

1. Locate the OTG Micro USB port on the bottom of the terminal and use a USB cable (not provided) to connect the terminal to your computer.



2. Upon the connection, the terminal will prompt you to "TURN ON USB STORAGE". Follow the on-screen instructions to proceed.



- 3. On your Windows computer, the terminal is recognized as a removable storage named **ROCKCHIP**.
- 4. When you're done transferring files between your computer and the terminal, simply close all programs and disconnect the USB cable.

2.5 Connecting to a Local Area Network

The terminal comes with a LAN port allowing you to connect the terminal to a wired local area network. The LAN port supports PoE, a standard that transmits power and data through one Ethernet cable. If you connect it to a PoE network equipment, then you don't need to connect the DC IN jack to a power outlet.

To connect the terminal to a wired network:

- Using a Ethernet cable, connect one end to the LAN port on the rear of the terminal.
- 2. Connect the other end of the Ethernet cable to a hub, switch or router.


With the LAN port connected to a network, you should configure the network settings as needed according to your network environment. For more information, see <u>3.4 Using the Ethernet Feature</u> on page <u>23</u>.

2.6 Attaching to a VESA Mount

The terminal supports 75mm M4 VESA mount so you can attach the terminal to a VESA mount kit.

To attach the terminal to a VESA mount kit:


1. Locate the four VESA mounting holes on the rear of the terminal.



- 2. Attach your VESA mount kit to the rear of the terminal by matching the mounting holes with the VESA mount kit.
- 3. Fix the assembly with screws.

2.7 Connecting to a Power Source

Caution: The terminal can be powered through PoE or 12V DC. You should use either one as the power source. Please do not apply both at the same time, otherwise the terminal will be damaged.



2.7.1 Connecting to AC Power

To connect the terminal to AC power:

- 1. Locate the **DC-IN** jack on the rear of the terminal. Plug the DC cord of the power adapter into the **DC-IN** jack.
- Plug one end of the AC power cord into the AC adapter and the other end into an electrical outlet.

Make sure to use the AC power adapter supplied with the terminal. The power adapter specification is as below:

Warning: Use only the power adapter that comes with your terminal. Using a different power adapter may damage the terminal and invalidate warranty applying to the terminal.

2.7.2 Connecting to a PoE PSE

If the power source is PoE PSE, connect the Ethernet cable (not provided) to the terminal's LAN port and a PoE-capable router or switch.

As PoE transmits both data and power in one Ethernet cable, if you are using the PoE connection, there is no need for connecting the DC-IN jack to a power outlet.

2.8 Powering On the Terminal

Press and hold the power button on the right side of the terminal to turn on the terminal.

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Chapter 3

Using the Medical Terminal

3.1 Using the Touch Screen

The terminal comes with a projected capacitive multi-touch screen. Touch control is the main way to interact with the terminal. Users are able to manipulate icons, graphic buttons, menus, the on-screen keyboard or any on-screen items with touch control. This chapter will walk you through the basic operations.

3.1.1 Basic Operations


The table below provides instructions on how to use the multi-touch screen:

Operation	Descriptions
Тар	Tap an item and quickly release to select an item, launch an application, or open a menu.
Tap and hold	Tap and hold an item or a blank area on the screen for a few seconds until a menu opens or an option appears.
Drag	Tap and hold on an item, such as an image or an icon, then move it to the target position. While dragging, do not release until you have reached the target position.
Swipe	Move your finger horizontally or vertically across the screen to scroll through the screen, App menu, pages, lists and so on.
Zoom in / out	Move two fingers closer together on an item, such as a picture, web page, or map, to zoom out, or move two fingers apart to zoom in.
Double tap	For some applications, quickly tap twice on an item to zoom in and double-tap again to zoom out.

3.1.2 Text Input

The terminal doesn't have a physical keyboard to receive user's text input. To input text on the device, it relies on the "on-screen keyboard" featured by the operating system. An "on-screen keyboard" is a virtual keyboard with most of the standard keys.


To open the on-screen keyboard, simply tap a text input field and the keyboard appears.



3.2 Home Screen

For M1016, the **Home** screen provides you with an instant access to device status, notifications, application shortcuts, folders and widgets. Simply tap an item and you can launch the associated application. You can also add desired items to the **Home** screen, extend the **Home** screen or personalize the wallpaper to tailor it to your personal needs.

When you power on the terminal for the first time, a typical **Home** screen might look like the example below:



The table below describes the elements on a typical **Home** screen:

Element	Descriptions
Status Bar	The Status Bar displays these information: The system time Wi-Fi signal strength Ethernet connection status Bluetooth connection status You can access the notification panel to see more information by swiping up the status bar.
Notifications Area	The Notifications Area informs you of new messages, events, alarms, and activities in progress. Applications you install on your device may show their own icons or messages in the area. You can turn off the notifications via the Quick Settings panel. See 3.3 Accessing the Settings Screen on page 22 for details.
Home Screen	Tap an item on this screen to launch that item. To delete an icon or widget, tap and hold that item until the remove symbol X appears on the top of the screen. Then move the icon to the X symbol. Tap and hold any empty spot on this screen to customize your home screen.
Widget	The miniature of an application that functions directly on the Home screen.
App Launcher	Tap it to open the App Launcher where all applications and widgets installed on the terminal can be viewed and launched. You can also touch and hold an application's icon to drag and drop it onto the Home screen.
Back Button	Tap to go to previous screen.
Home Button	Tap to return to Home screen.
Recent App Button	Tap to view your recent Apps and touch an App to reopen it. To remove an App from the list, swipe it left or right.

3.2.1 Extending Home Screen

The **Home** screen is extended beyond the screen width to provide more space for adding application shortcuts and widgets.

To access the extended **Home** screen, swipe on the **Home** screen to the left or right.

To add application icons or widgets to the extended **Home** screen:

- 1. Tap the **App Launcher** icon **...** on the **Home** screen to locate the target application icon or widget.
- 2. Tap and hold the target icon or widget until the extended **Home** Screen appears.
- 3. Move the icon or widget to desired screen and then release.

3.3 Accessing the Settings Screen

Swiping down the status bar will bring up a **Notification** panel where you can quickly access recent notifications. Swipe down the panel again to bring up the **Quick Settings** panel where you can perform these tasks:


- Tap the Settings icon 🗱 to access the **Settings** screen
- Adjust the screen brightness
- Tap the Wi-Fi icon to access the Wi-Fi settings screen
- Tap the Bluetooth icon to access the Bluetooth settings screen
- Turn on/off airplane mode
- Turn on/off auto-rotate screen function.
- Tap the location icon to enable/disable the location function
- Tap the cast screen to transmit the device's screen to a Chromecast dongle

Swiping down the status bar brings up the **Notification** panel.



Swiping down the notification panel brings up the **Quick Settings** panel.

3.4 Using the Ethernet Feature


If the terminal is connected to a network through the LAN port, you will need to configure the network settings according to your network environment. To configure the network settings:

- Tap the **Settings** icon on the home screen and then tap **Ethernet** to access the **Ethernet** settings page.
- Switch on Ethernet if it isn't enabled yet. The status bar displays the sicon when the Ethernet function is enabled.



3. Configure the network settings as needed:

To use a static IP address, tab **Ethernet IP mode**. Select **static** and then configure the required settings. When you're done with the settings, tap **CONNECT**.



To obtain a dynamic IP address from a DHCP server, tab **Ethernet IP mode** and select **dhcp**. Then you will be taken back to the previous screen.



4. When you're done with the network settings, the terminal will connect to the network and displays the icon in the status bar.

3.5 Using the Wi-Fi Feature

The terminal is capable of Wi-Fi networking. Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that uses an access point, also known as the "hotspot", to connect to an Internet service provider over the wireless local area network (WLAN). Some hotspots are open to connect while others request you to present a key

to authenticate your connection. The terminal needs to be configured including such key to connect to a hotspot.


Follow the guide below to connect the terminal to your wireless local area network:

3.5.1 Enabling Wi-Fi and Connecting to a WLAN

- 1. Tap the **Settings** icon on the home screen and then tap **Wi-Fi** to access the Wi-Fi settings page.

The device then proceeds to scan for available Wi-Fi networks in range and displays the names of those found. Secured networks are displayed with waves denoting signal strength plus a lock on them $\widehat{\ }$ while the open networks don't.

To re-scan for available Wi-Fi networks, tap the menu icon in the upper right corner to open the context menu and then tap **Refresh**.



Tap a network to connect to it. To connect to a secured network, you're prompted to enter a password or other credentials. (Ask your network administrator for details.)

If the terminal detects a network previously connected to, the terminal autoconnects to it. Once a Wi-Fi network is connected, it displays as "connected" on the Wi-Fi settings screen. Tap it to see the details about the speed, security, address, and related info.


3.5.2 Adding a Wi-Fi Network

Under the following situations, you may need to manually add a Wi-Fi network:


- When a Wi-Fi network doesn't broadcast its name (SSID)
- When a Wi-Fi network is out of range and you want the terminal to remember it and auto-connect to it as soon as it gets in range.

To add a Wi-Fi network:

- 1. Tap the **Settings** icon on the home screen and then tap **Wi-Fi** to access the Wi-Fi settings page.
- 2. Switch on Wi-Fi if it isn't enabled yet.
- 3. Tap the menu icon in the upper right corner to open the context menu and then tap **Add network**.



4. Enter the SSID (name) of the network. If the network is secured, tap the triangle at the right of the **Security** field to select the type of security deployed on the network and enter any required security credentials. If you need to configure proxy and IP settings, tap **Advanced options** to proceed.



5. Tap Save.

The terminal then proceeds to connect to the Wi-Fi network. Any credentials entered are saved so the terminal automatically connects it the next time the terminal gets it within the range.

3.5.3 Connecting to a Wi-Fi Network by WPS

Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) is a feature that allows WPS-compliant devices to connect to each other instantly in a secure way. As the WPS devices automatically configure the SSID and WPA security key, it eliminates the need for users to manually enter the SSID and password. WPS works in two methods: Push or personal identification number (PIN). To connect to a Wi-Fi network via WPS:

- 1. Tap the **Settings** icon on the home screen and then tap **Wi-Fi** to access the Wi-Fi settings page.
- 2. Switch on Wi-Fi if it isn't enabled yet.
- 3. Tap the menu icon in the upper right corner to open the context menu and then tap **Advanced**.
- 4. Use either of the following methods to make the connection:

To use Push button, tap **WPS Push Button** and a prompt message will appear. Then press the WPS button on your WPS router within two minutes



To use PIN method, tap **WPS Pin Entry**. You will be prompted with a PIN. Enter that PIN on your Wi-Fi router within two minutes.



5. WPS authentication process will start. When the authentication is done, you will be prompted that connection is successful.

3.5.4 Forgetting/Modifying a Wi-Fi Network

When you don't want the terminal to "auto" connect to a Wi-Fi network or when it is a network that you no longer use, remove the Wi-Fi network by the steps below:

- 1. Tap the **Settings** icon on the home screen and then tap **Wi-Fi** to access the Wi-Fi settings page.
- On the Wi-Fi settings page, tap and hold the name of the network to forget.A context menu then opens.
- 3. Tap Forget network.



Some Wi-Fi networks may periodically change their passwords to enhance the network security. When this occurs, you need to change the saved login credentials. To change the password, follow the steps above to access the context menu of the intended network. Then tap **Modify network** to make the changes.

3.6 Using the Bluetooth Feature

Bluetooth enables the wireless connection over a short distance about 8 meters. It is specified as a "wireless personal area network" (WPAN). The terminal is Bluetooth-capable to synchronize data with other Bluetooth-capable devices such as PCs, laptops, hands-free, headsets, printers, PDAs and cell phones.

Before the terminal can connect a Bluetooth device, it needs to pair with that device. Such "pairing" involves the authentication between them to justify their accesses to each other. Once they are paired, they stay paired unless they are unpaired.

3.6.1 Enabling Bluetooth and Pairing with Bluetooth Device


To enable or disable the Bluetooth function:


- 1. Tap the **Settings** icon on the home screen and then tap **Bluetooth** to access the Bluetooth settings page.
- 2. Switch on Bluetooth if it isn't enabled yet. The status bar displays the icon when the Bluetooth function is enabled.

Note: While Bluetooth is enabled, the terminal is always visible to nearby devices in the name of M1016. You cannot configure the visibility time but you can rename the terminal's name.

3. The terminal proceeds to scan for any Bluetooth device in range. Then it displays the names of the device(s) found.


If the Bluetooth device you want to pair with is not displayed in the **Available Devices** list, tap the menu icon in the upper right corner to open the context menu and then tap **Refresh**. Or you can tap the search icon and then enter the name of the Bluetooth device you want to pair with.





Note: If the device to pair with isn't displayed after the scan, check if it is configured to be discoverable.

4. Tap the device you want to pair with. When the **Bluetooth pairing request** dialog box appears, tap **Pair**. The terminal will then send a connection request to the device you want to pair with.



On the device to pair with, a dialog box appears requesting to enter or verify the pairing code. The passkey entered or shown on the terminal and the Bluetooth device must be the same.

If you're prompted to enter a pin code, try entering 0000 or 1234 (the most common pin code), or look up in the documentation that came with the other Bluetooth device to learn its pin code.

Then the devices proceed to pair with each other.

3.6.2 Configuring Bluetooth Features to Use

A "Bluetooth profile" defines the features supported by a Bluetooth device. For two Bluetooth devices to share files with each other, they need to both support the right profile. Some Bluetooth devices have multiple profiles. A profile can provide the ability to transmit phone conversations, to play music in stereo, or to transfer files or other data.

After you have paired a Bluetooth device with the terminal, you can select which profile you want to use with your tablet.

1. Tap the **Settings** icon on the home screen and then tap **Bluetooth** to access the Bluetooth settings page. Find the paired device that you want to configure the profiles and tap the sticon of the paired device.

2. A page opens for that paired device. Select or deselect a profile as needed.



3.6.3 Disconnect from a Bluetooth Device

To disconnect the terminal from a Bluetooth device:

- 1. Tap the **Settings** icon on the home screen and then tap **Bluetooth** to access the Bluetooth settings page.
- 2. Find the paired device that you want to disconnect and tap the * icon of the paired device.
- 3. A page opens for that paired device. Tap Forget.



3.6.4 Additional Bluetooth Settings

From the Bluetooth settings page, tap the menu icon and a context menu opens providing the following options:

- 1. **Rename tablet:** Allows you to edit the Bluetooth name of the terminal that will be shown to others when they try to search for it.
- 2. **Show received files:** Open the location where downloaded and uploaded Bluetooth files are stored.


3.7 Using the Camera Feature

The device is equipped with a front-facing camera. Using the native camera application that comes with the terminal, you can take pictures or videos.

3.7.1 Taking a Photo

To take a photo:

- 1. On the main screen tap the **App Launcher** icon ******* and then tap the camera App icon ******.
- 2. The camera application then opens. A typical screen is as shown below:



- 3. If needed, you can move two fingers apart to zoom in or move two fingers closer together to zoom out.
- 4. To configure advanced settings, swipe the screen right and then tap the **Settings** icon in the upper right corner.



In the **Settings** screen, you can configure the image resolution & quality, saved location, and enable/disable manual exposure.




- 5. To take a photo, tap the camera icon.
- 6. To view the photo(s) just taken, swipe left the screen.

3.7.2 Recording a Video

To record a video:


- 1. On the **Home** screen tap the **App Launcher** icon ******* and then tap the camera App icon ******.
- 2. The camera application then opens. Swipe the screen and tap **Video** to switch to video mode. A typical video-recording screen is as shown below:



- 3. If needed, you can move two fingers apart to zoom in or move two fingers closer together to zoom out.
- 4. To configure advanced settings, swipe the screen right and then tap the **Settings** icon in the upper right corner.



5. To record a video, tap the video icon. During the recording, you may zoom in or out as needed. When you're done with the recording, tap the stop icon.




6. To view the video(s) just recorded, swipe left the screen.

3.8 Using the RFID Feature (Optional)

Radio-Frequency Identification (RFID) is a technology that uses radio frequency (RF) for a RFID reader to retrieve information from a RFID tag attached to an object. Different from a barcode technology, RFID technology does not require direct contact or line-of-sight reading; however, the read range depends on frequency, tag antenna, tag type and a number of factors.

The RFID reader area is at the back side of the terminal as shown below.




To read a RFID tag:

- Launch your RFID App.
- 2. Place the RFID tag near the RFID reader on the back of the terminal.
 - RFID read range varies depending on your application. Contact your dealer for details.
- 3. After reading and decoding, the RFID tag data will be displayed.

3.9 Using the NFC Feature (Optional)

Near Field Communication (NFC) is a short-range wireless communication technology that enables NFC-capable devices to exchange data such as contacts, photos, music, or web address over a short distance less than 4 centimeters.


The NFC detection area is at the back side of the terminal as shown below. When you tap other NFC devices, tags, or readers, the NFC areas of both devices should be close to one another so that the connection can be established.



3.9.1 Using the Android Beam Feature

To use NFC to exchange App contents, both sending and receiving devices must be NFC-enabled and unlocked. The following is an example describing how to beam App content from the terminal to another NFC device:

Make sure both devices are NFC-enabled. To enable the terminal's NFC function, tap the **Settings** icon on the home screen and then tap **More** under the **Wireless & networks** section. Then enable the NFC function.



- 2. On the terminal, open the content you want to exchange.
- Make sure the screen of both devices are unlocked, then hold your terminal and the receiving device back to back so that the NFC detection areas of both devices are within a range of about 4 centimeters.
- 4. On the terminal, you will hear a sound and be prompted a message "**Touch to beam"**. Touch the screen of the terminal to begin the beaming process.
- 5. The content will appear on the receiving device's screen.

3.9.2 Using the Tap & Pay Feature

You can tap and pay with the terminal at the merchants that accept contactless payments. To use the tap & pay function, make sure you have enabled the terminal's NFC function via **Settings > Wireless & networks > More > NFC**.
