Important Safety Instructions

Rechargeable Battery Pack Safety

- **Important Terms to Understand**

“Battery life” means the time the equipment will run before it must be recharged (sometimes this is also called “playtime” or “runtime”).

“Battery lifespan” means the total amount of time your battery will last before it must be replaced.

- **Using the Equipment for the First Time**

Be sure to fully charge (approx. 4 hours) the equipment when charging the equipment for the first time.

- **Long-Term Storage & Maintenance**

If you are putting away the battery for more than three months, it is recommended that the battery should be stored separately and fully charged, and get recharged every three months. If you store an uncharged battery, it could fall into a deep worn-out state which would render it incapable of holding any charge. Be sure to store the equipment and battery at the proper temperature.

- **Battery Lifespan**

The removable batteries for the equipment are designed to retain up to 80% of their original capacity after 300 charging and recharging cycles when properly maintained. You may choose to purchase new battery when it no longer holds the sufficient charge that meets your needs.

- The lithium-ion battery is currently one of the most popular battery packs. The best advantage is that it has no memory effect, so users needn't worry about that issue. Users can charge the battery anytime whether it is fully drained or not. However, it's recommended that users drain the battery until the system shows power shortage warning and then recharge the battery. Doing so is helpful to the reliability of your battery.
- Don't use the battery pack as a power supply for other equipment.
- Don't expose the battery to elevated heat situations such as under direct sunlight in a car or near fire.

- Don't disassemble the battery, or the battery leakage might cause skin or eye injury. If electrolyte leaking from the battery contacts your skin or clothing, immediately flush it with running water. If it splashes into eye, rinse the eye at least 15 minutes with clean water and then seek medical attention.
- To avoid battery leakage or explosion, don't discard the battery into water or fire, or put them near a heat source such as a gas stove or an oven.
- If you are putting away the battery for more than three months, it is recommended that the battery should be stored separately and fully charged, and get recharged every three months. - Use the appropriate container to store the battery such as a paper box. Do not allow a metal object to touch the tablet PC of the battery.
- The battery consists of precise electrical components and cells. Do not drop or hit the battery.

General Cleaning Tips

You may need the following precautions before you begin to clean the device. When you clean any single part or component for the device, please thoroughly read and understand the details below.

1. We strongly recommended that you should shut down the system before you start to clean any single components.
2. When you need to clean the device, please rub it with a piece of dry cloth.
3. Be cautious of the tiny removable components when you use a vacuum cleaner to absorb the dirt on the floor.
4. Never drop the components inside the device or get circuit board damp or wet.
5. Be cautious of all kinds of cleaning solvents or chemicals when you use it for the sake of cleaning. Some individuals may be allergic to the ingredients.
6. Try not to put any food, drink or cigarette around the device.

Cleaning Tools

Although many companies have created products to help improve the process of cleaning your devices and peripherals, users can also use household items to clean their devices and peripherals. Below is a listing of items you may need or want to use while cleaning your devices or peripherals. Keep in mind that some components in your device may only be able to be cleaned using a product designed for cleaning that component, if this is the case it will be mentioned in the cleaning.

- **Cotton swabs:** Cotton swabs moistened with rubbing alcohol or water are excellent tools for wiping hard to reach areas in your keyboard, mouse, and other locations.
- **Foam swabs:** Whenever possible, it is better to use lint-free swabs such as foam swabs.

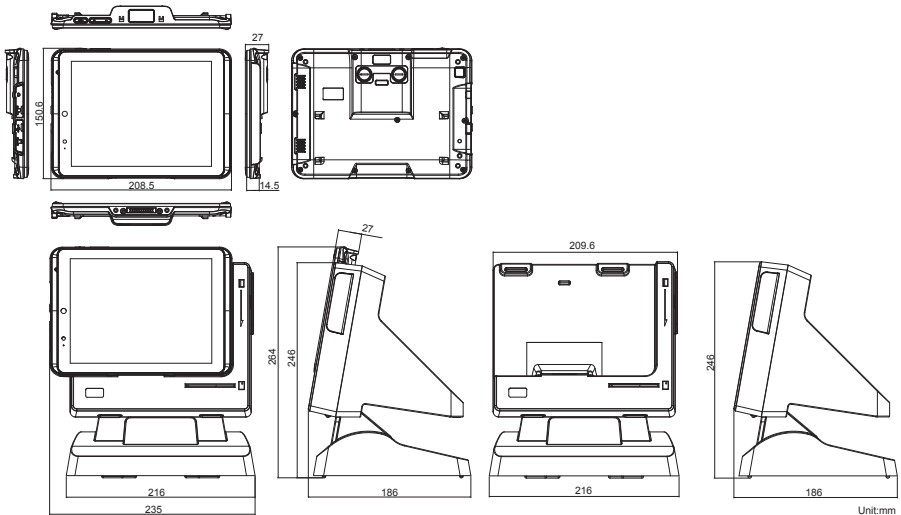

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Chapter 2

Getting Started

2.1 Getting to Know the Tablet PC

2.1.1 Tablet PC



2.1.1.1 Front Side

Items	Descriptions
Power Key	Press-and-hold this key to power on the device In sleep mode, press to wake the device Press to power off the device.

2.2 Installing Memory Card

The tablet PC comes with a microSD card slot. To insert the microSD card:

1. On the left side of the tablet PC, open the rubber cover of the microSD card slot.
2. Position the card as the graphic indicates.
3. Fully insert the card into the slot until it clicks into place.
4. Close the rubber cover.



To verify if the memory card is successfully inserted:

- **For Windows:** Windows will detect the card and assign it a drive name in **File Explorer**.
- **For Android:** Tap the **Settings** icon on the home screen and then tap **Device > Storage > SD card**. If the SD card is successfully mounted, you should be able to find the SD card information.

2.3 Charging the Tablet PC

To charge the tablet PC with the provided power adapter:

1. Connect the USB end of the power adapter to the USB port on the device.
2. Connect the power adapter to an electrical outlet.



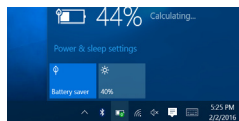
*The power plug type of the provided power adapter varies according to region.

Caution: Do not charge the tablet PC via computer's USB connection due to that the voltage output from computer USB is not enough to charge the device.

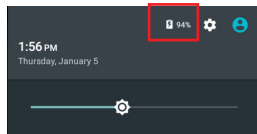
Caution: When the tablet PC is docked in the cradle, do not connect the tablet PC and the cradle to power source at the same time to prevent damage to the products.

When the charging is in process, to check the battery level:

- **For Windows:** Swipe up the battery icon in the system tray to view the charging status.



- **For Android:** Swipe down the battery indicator in the status bar and you will see the charging percentage.



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Chapter 3

Using the Tablet PC (Windows OS)

3.1 Using the Touch Screen

The computer comes with a projected capacitive touch screen. Touch control is the main way and an intuitive way to interact with the computer. Users are able to manipulate icons, graphic buttons, menus, property sheets, the on-screen keyboard or any on-screen items with touch control. This chapter will walk you through the basic operations for touch control.

3.1.1 Basic Operations

Unlike the resistive touch, the projected capacitive touch works by the change of capacitance when a conductive object, such as a finger, contact the touch screen. Hence it requires only a human finger and zero force to trigger actions from the projected capacitive touch screen. And no calibration is needed.

The table below provides instructions on how to use the multi-touch screen:

Operation	Descriptions
Tap	Tap an item and quickly release to select an item, launch an application, or open a menu.
Tap and hold	Tap and hold an item or a blank area on the screen for a few seconds until a menu opens or an option appears.
Drag	Tap and hold on an item, such as an image or an icon, then move it to the target position. While dragging, do not release until you have reached the target position.
Swipe	Move your finger horizontally or vertically across the screen to scroll through the screen, App menu, pages, lists and so on.
Zoom in / out	Move two fingers closer together on an item, such as a picture, web page, or map, to zoom out, or move two fingers apart to zoom in.
Double tap	For some applications, quickly tap twice on an item to zoom in and double-tap again to zoom out.

3.1.2 Text Input

The computer doesn't have a physical keyboard to receive user's text input. To input text on the computer, it relies on either an external USB keyboard, or the "on-screen keyboard", or the Windows-featured handwriting recognition.

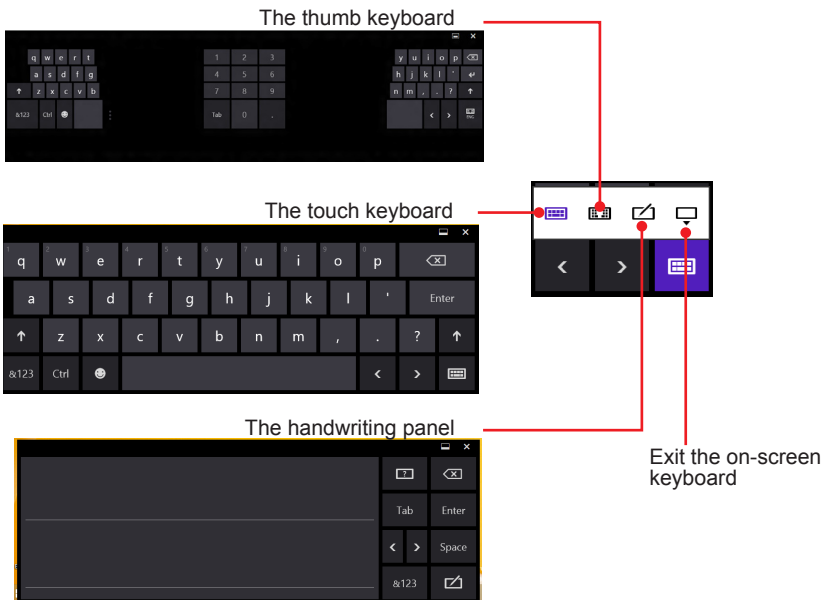
3.1.2.1 On-screen Keyboard

An "on-screen keyboard" is a virtual keyboard with all the standard keys. With Windows you can use either a touch keyboard or thumb keyboard to facilitate text input. To open the Windows on-screen keyboard:

1. Tap the keyboard icon on the Windows taskbar.



2. The **Input Panel** opens in either keyboard mode or handwriting mode, according to your previous use. Tap the icon in the lower right corner to switch between the modes.



3. To use the touch or thumb keyboard, just enter text by tapping the keys.

3.1.2.2 Handwriting Recognition

“Handwriting Recognition” is an input method that interprets and converts handwriting to text. The Windows features a “writing pad” to get the job done.

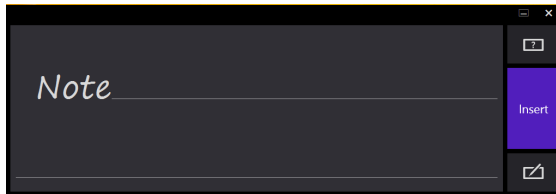
To launch the Windows handwriting panel:

1. Tap the keyboard icon on the Windows taskbar to open the **Input Panel** as described in [3.1.2.2 Handwriting Recognition](#) on page 16.

If it's in keyboard mode, tap the icon in the lower right corner and tap the handwriting icon to switch to handwriting mode.



2. Write in the writing area. Then tap the bottom-right **Enter** button to enter the text in a text field.

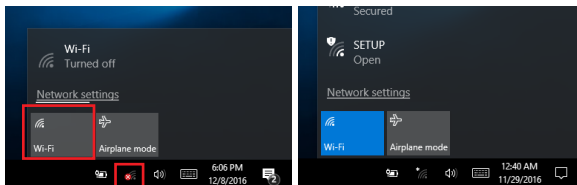


3.3 Using the Wi-Fi Feature

The computer is built-in with a Wi-Fi module for Wi-Fi networking. The Wi-Fi module supports IEEE 802.11a/b/g/n/ac.

3.3.1 Turning On/Off the Wi-Fi Feature

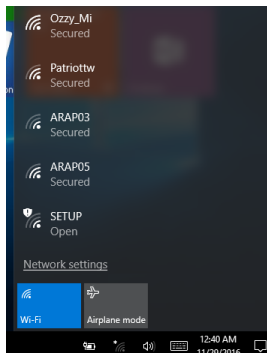
If you have previously turned off the Wi-Fi function, tap the wireless network icon in the system tray and then tap Wi-Fi to turn on the Wi-Fi radio.



To turn off the Wi-Fi function, tap the wireless network icon in the system tray and then tap Wi-Fi to turn off the Wi-Fi radio.

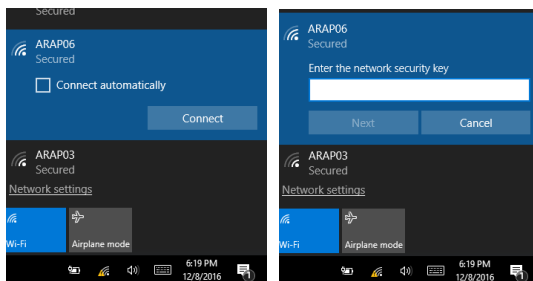
3.3.2 Connecting to a W-Fi Network

1. Make sure that the Wi-Fi function is turned on.
2. Tap the Wi-Fi signal strength icon in the notification area.
3. A list opens and shows the Wi-Fi hotspots available within the wireless coverage of the tablet PC.

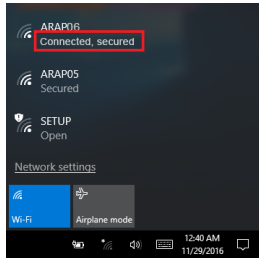


4. Tap the target network and then tap **Connect**.

If the network to connect is a secured network, a dialog will open and request for the password. Enter the password to access the Wi-Fi network. If it is an open network, it will be connected directly.



- When the tablet PC is connected to a Wi-Fi network, “**Connected**” will be displayed under the Wi-Fi network’s name.



Note: To conserve power, always turn off the Wi-Fi module when it isn’t used.

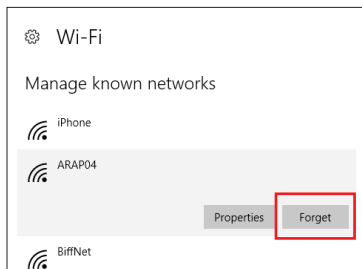
3.3.3 Forgetting/Deleting a Wi-Fi Network

Under the following situations you may need the tablet PC to forget/delete a Wi-Fi connection profile:

- You don’t need to connect to a certain wireless connection anymore.
- You want to modify the security details such as the password and the encryption type it uses. In such case, after you forget the network, re-connect to the network and enter new security details when prompted.

To forget/delete a Wi-Fi network connectoin:

- Tap **START > Settings > Network & Internet > Wi-Fi > Manage Wi-Fi Settings**.
- Under **Manage known networks**, select the target network and tap **Forget**. This will delete the wireless network’s profile and connection details.



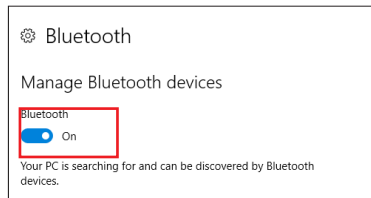
3.4 Using the Bluetooth Feature

Bluetooth enables the wireless connection over a short distance about 8 meters. It is specified as a “wireless personal area network” (WPAN). The computer is Bluetooth-enabled to synchronize data with other Bluetooth-capable devices such as PCs, laptops, hands-free, headsets, printers, PDAs and cell phones.

3.4.1 Turning On/Off the Bluetooth Feature

To be able to use Bluetooth, launch the Bluetooth module first:

Tap **START > Settings > Devices > Bluetooth**. Make sure the Bluetooth switch is in the **On** position.

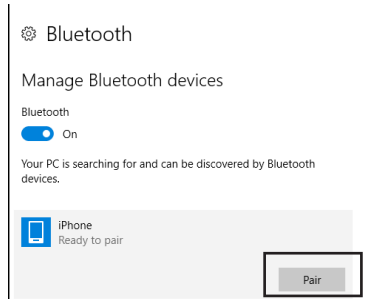


To turn off the Bluetooth module, switch the Bluetooth to the **Off** position.

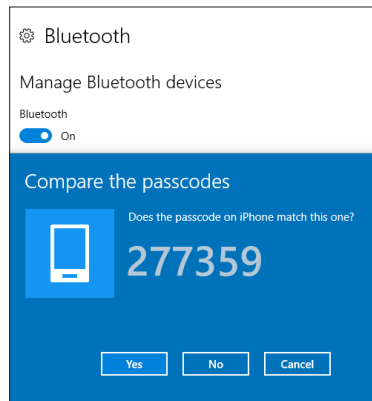
3.4.2 Pairing/Connecting with Other Bluetooth Devices

Before the computer can connect with other Bluetooth devices, it has to pair with them. To pair/connect with other Bluetooth devices:

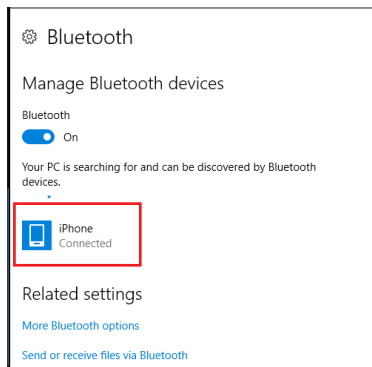
1. Before proceeding, make sure that the target Bluetooth device is turned on, discoverable and within close range.
2. Make sure that the Bluetooth function is turned on. From the Bluetooth devices list, select the device you want to pair and click **Pair**.



3. If prompted to compare the passcodes, tap **Yes** to continue.



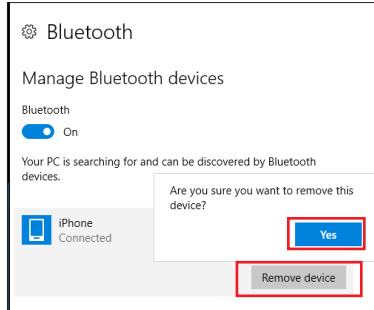
4. After pairing, the tablet PC will connect to the target device and you'll notice the **Connected** under the device name.



3.4.3 Removing a Bluetooth Device

If you want to remove a Bluetooth device paired with your tablet PC:

1. Tap **START > Settings > Devices > Bluetooth**.
2. Select the paired Bluetooth device that you want to remove and tap **Remove device**. When prompted, tap **Yes**.



If you want to connect the device to your tablet PC later, you can pair it again.

3.4.3 Bluetooth Device Name of the Tablet PC

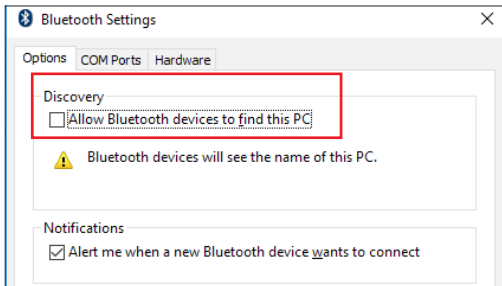
By default, the tablet PC's Bluetooth device name is the computer name, which is viewable at **START > Settings > System > About**.

You can rename the name for your Table PC by tapping **Rename PC** and then type the new name as needed.



3.4.4 Hiding/Exposing the Tablet PC

By default, the tablet PC is discoverable by other Bluetooth devices. To hide or expose the computer, tap **START > Settings > Devices > More Bluetooth options**. Then select **Allow Bluetooth devices to find this PC** to make the tablet PC discoverable, or otherwise un-select it to hide your tablet PC.



3.6 Using the Barcode Scanner

The tablet PC comes with a barcode reader module. You can read barcodes of the following types:

OCR Option	OCR-A, OCR-B, E13B (MICR)

Generally a third-party barcode application will be used to process the data read by the scanner. This user manual will not cover these applications. The following steps serve as an example only to show the basic operation of the barcode scanner.

1. Launch your barcode decoding application.
2. Point the scanner window at the barcode and press either of the barcode trigger buttons on the rear of the tablet PC. The scanner will project an aiming beam.



Press either of the barcode trigger buttons to scan

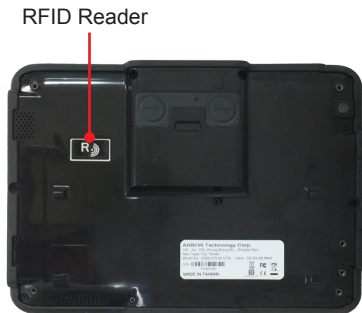


3. Upon a successful scan, the scan beam turns off. The decoded barcode data will be entered into your processing application.

3.7 Using the RFID Feature (Optional)

Radio-Frequency Identification (RFID) is a technology that uses radio frequency (RF) for a RFID reader to retrieve information from a RFID tag attached to an object. Different from a barcode technology, RFID technology does not require direct contact or line-of-sight reading; however, the read range depends on frequency, tag antenna, tag type and a number of factors.

The RFID reader area is at the back side of the tablet PC as shown below.



To read a RFID tag:

1. Launch your RFID App.
2. Place the RFID tag near the RFID reader on the back of the tablet PC.

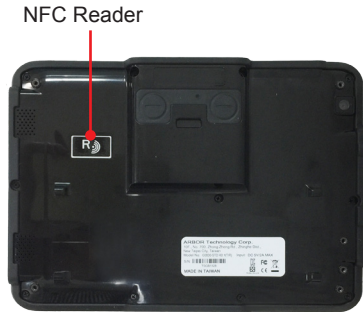
RFID read range varies depending on your application. Contact your dealer for details.

3. After reading and decoding, the RFID tag data will be displayed.

3.8 Using the NFC Feature (Optional)

Near Field Communication (NFC) is a short-range wireless communication technology that enables NFC-capable devices to exchange data such as contacts, photos, music, or web address over a short distance less than 4 centimeters.

The NFC detection area is at the back side of the tablet PC as shown below. When you tap other NFC devices, tags, or readers, the NFC areas of both devices should be close to one another so that the connection can be established.



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Chapter 4

Using the Tablet PC (Android OS)

4.1 Using the Touch Screen

The tablet PC comes with a projected capacitive multi-touch screen. Touch control is the main way to interact with the tablet PC. Users are able to manipulate icons, graphic buttons, menus, the on-screen keyboard or any on-screen items with touch control. This chapter will walk you through the basic operations.

4.1.1 Basic Operations

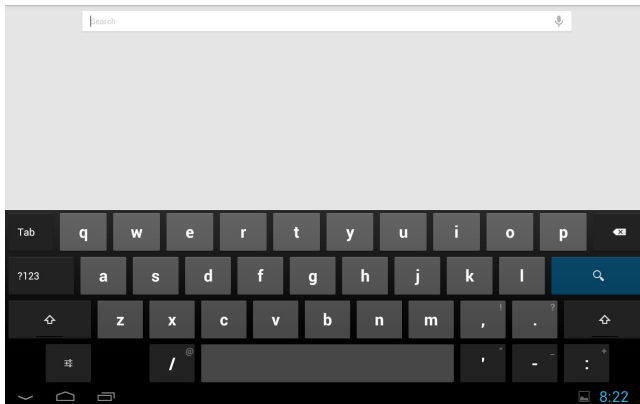
The table below provides instructions on how to use the multi-touch screen:

Operation	Descriptions
Tap	Tap an item and quickly release to select an item, launch an application, or open a menu.
Tap and hold	Tap and hold an item or a blank area on the screen for a few seconds until a menu opens or an option appears.
Drag	Tap and hold on an item, such as an image or an icon, then move it to the target position. While dragging, do not release until you have reached the target position.
Swipe	Move your finger horizontally or vertically across the screen to scroll through the screen, App menu, pages, lists and so on.
Zoom in / out	Move two fingers closer together on an item, such as a picture, web page, or map, to zoom out, or move two fingers apart to zoom in.
Double tap	For some applications, quickly tap twice on an item to zoom in and double-tap again to zoom out.

4.1.2 Text Input

The tablet PC doesn't have a physical keyboard to receive user's text input. To input text on the device, it relies on the "on-screen keyboard" featured by the operating system. An "on-screen keyboard" is a virtual keyboard with most of the standard keys.

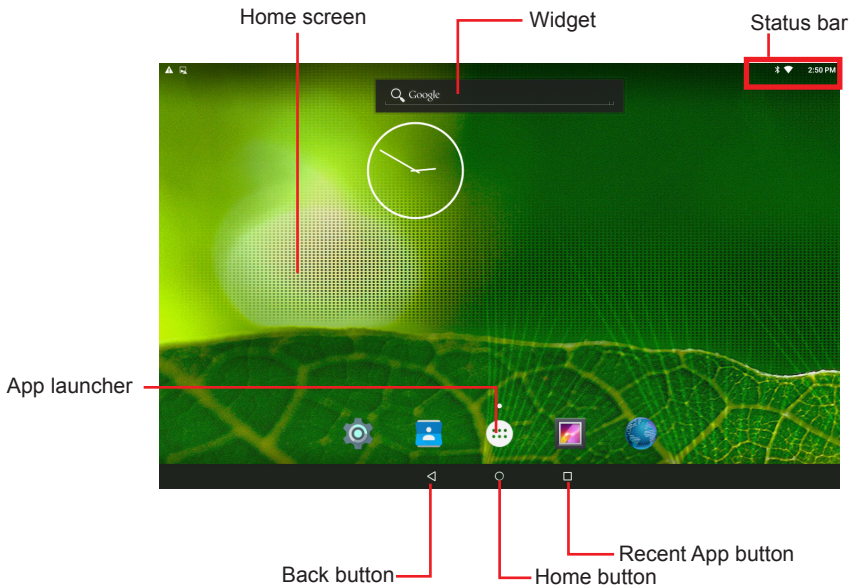
To open the on-screen keyboard, simply tap a text input field and the keyboard appears.



4.2 Home Screen

On the Android OS, the **Home** screen provides you with an instant access to device status, notifications, application shortcuts, folders and widgets. Simply tap an item and you can launch the associated application. You can also add desired items to the **Home** screen, extend the **Home** screen or personalize the wallpaper to tailor it to your personal needs.

When you power on the tablet PC for the first time, a typical **Home** screen might look like the example below:



The table below describes the elements on a typical **Home** screen:


Element	Descriptions
Status Bar	<p>The Status Bar displays these information:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The system time • Wi-Fi signal strength • Ethernet connection status • Bluetooth connection status <p>You can access the notification panel to see more information by swiping up the status bar.</p>
Notifications Area	<p>The Notifications Area informs you of new messages, events, alarms, and activities in progress. Applications you install on your device may show their own icons or messages in the area.</p>
Home Screen	<p>Tap an item on this screen to launch that item.</p> <p>To delete an icon or widget, tap and hold that item until the remove symbol X appears on the top of the screen. Then move the icon to the X symbol.</p> <p>Tap and hold any empty spot on this screen to customize your home screen.</p>
Widget	<p>The miniature of an application that functions directly on the Home screen.</p>
App Launcher	<p>Tap it to open the App Launcher where all applications and widgets installed on the tablet PC can be viewed and launched.</p> <p>You can also touch and hold an application's icon to drag and drop it onto the Home screen.</p>
Back Button	<p>Tap to go to previous screen.</p>
Home Button	<p>Tap to return to Home screen.</p>
Recent App Button	<p>Tap to view your recent Apps and touch an App to reopen it. To remove an App from the list, swipe it left or right.</p>

4.2.1 Extending Home Screen

The **Home** screen is extended beyond the screen width to provide more space for adding application shortcuts and widgets.


To access the extended **Home** screen, swipe on the **Home** screen to the left or right.

To add application icons or widgets to the extended **Home** screen:

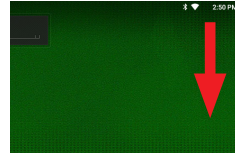
1. Tap the **App Launcher** icon  on the **Home** screen to locate the target application icon or widget.
2. Tap and hold the target icon or widget until the extended **Home** Screen appears.
3. Move the icon or widget to desired screen and then release.

4.3 Accessing the Settings Screen

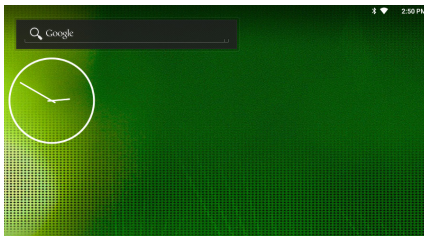
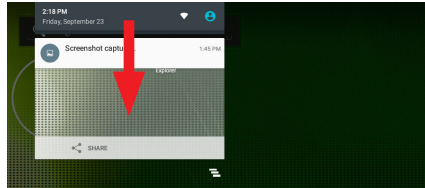
Swiping down the status bar will bring up a **Notification** panel where you can quickly access recent notifications. Swipe down the panel again to bring up the **Quick Settings** panel where you can perform these tasks:

- Tap the Settings icon  to access the **Settings** screen
- Adjust the screen brightness
- Tap the Wi-Fi icon to access the Wi-Fi settings screen
- Tap the Bluetooth icon to access the Bluetooth settings screen
- Turn on/off airplane mode
- Turn on/off auto-rotate screen function
- Tap the location icon to enable/disable the location function
- Tap the cast screen to transmit the device's screen to a Chromecast dongle

Swiping down the status bar brings up the **Notification** panel.



Swiping down the notification panel brings up the **Quick Settings** panel.

4.4 Using the Wi-Fi Feature


The tablet PC is capable of Wi-Fi networking. Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that uses an access point, also known as the “hotspot”, to connect to an Internet service provider over the wireless local area network (WLAN). Some hotspots are open to connect while others request you to present a key to authenticate your connection. The tablet PC needs to be configured including such key to connect to a hotspot.

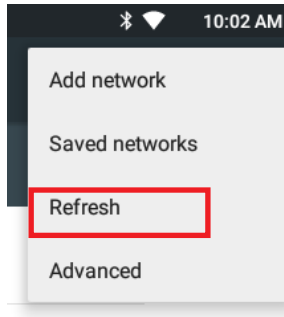
Follow the guide below to connect the tablet PC to your wireless local area network:

4.4.1 Enabling Wi-Fi and Connecting to a WLAN

1. Tap the **Settings** icon on the home screen and then tap **Wi-Fi** to access the Wi-Fi settings page.
2. Switch on Wi-Fi if it isn't enabled yet. The status bar displays the  icon when the Ethernet function is enabled.

The device then proceeds to scan for available Wi-Fi networks in range and displays the names of those found. Secured networks are displayed with waves denoting signal strength plus a lock on them  while the open networks don't.

To re-scan for available Wi-Fi networks, tap the menu icon  in the upper right corner to open the context menu and then tap **Refresh**.



Tap a network to connect to it. To connect to a secured network, you're prompted to enter a password or other credentials. (Ask your network administrator for details.)

If the tablet PC detects a network previously connected to, the tablet PC auto-connects to it.


Once a Wi-Fi network is connected, it displays as "connected" on the Wi-Fi settings screen. Tap it to see the details about the speed, security, address, and related info.

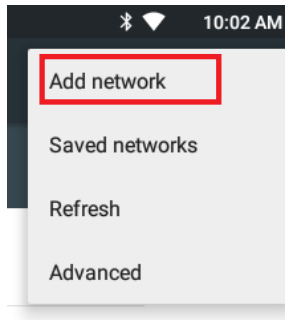
4.4.2 Adding a Wi-Fi Network

Under the following situations, you may need to manually add a Wi-Fi network:

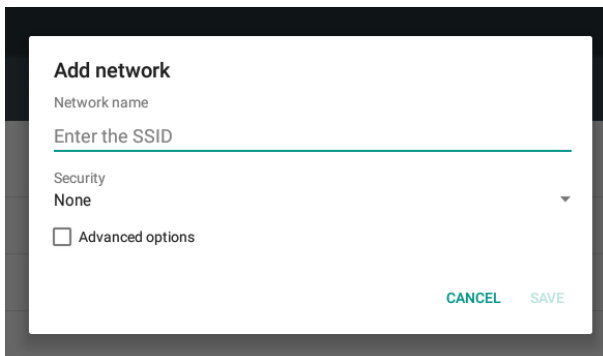
- When a Wi-Fi network doesn't broadcast its name (SSID)
- When a Wi-Fi network is out of range and you want the tablet PC to remember it and auto-connect to it as soon as it gets in range.

To add a Wi-Fi network:

1. Tap the **Settings** icon on the home screen and then tap **Wi-Fi** to access the Wi-Fi settings page.
2. Switch on Wi-Fi if it isn't enabled yet.
3. Tap the menu icon  in the upper right corner to open the context menu and then tap **Add network**.



4. Enter the SSID (name) of the network. If the network is secured, tap the triangle at the right of the **Security** field to select the type of security deployed on the network and enter any required security credentials. If you need to configure proxy and IP settings, tap **Advanced options** to proceed.




5. Tap **Save**.

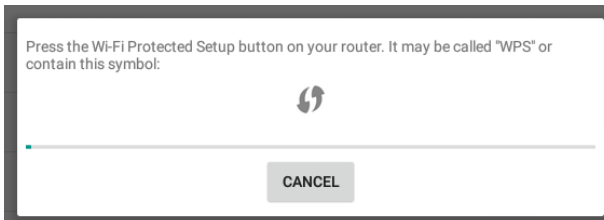
The tablet PC then proceeds to connect to the Wi-Fi network. Any credentials entered are saved so the tablet PC automatically connects it the next time the tablet PC gets it within the range.

4.4.3 Connecting to a Wi-Fi Network by WPS

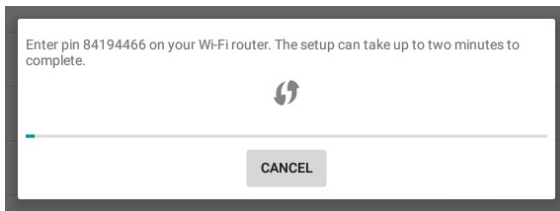
Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) is a feature that allows WPS-compliant devices to connect to each other instantly in a secure way. As the WPS devices automatically configure the SSID and WPA security key, it eliminates the need for users to manually enter the SSID and password. WPS works in two methods: Push or personal identification number (PIN). To connect to a Wi-Fi network via WPS:

1. Tap the **Settings** icon on the home screen and then tap **Wi-Fi** to access the Wi-Fi settings page.
2. Switch on Wi-Fi if it isn't enabled yet.
3. Tap the menu icon  in the upper right corner to open the context menu and then tap **Advanced**.
4. Use either of the following methods to make the connection:

To use Push button, tap **WPS Push Button** and a prompt message will appear. Then press the WPS button on your WPS router within two minutes



To use PIN method, tap **WPS Pin Entry**. You will be prompted with a PIN. Enter that PIN on your Wi-Fi router within two minutes.



5. WPS authentication process will start. When the authentication is done, you will be prompted that connection is successful.

4.4.4 Forgetting/Modifying a Wi-Fi Network

When you don't want the tablet PC to "auto" connect to a Wi-Fi network or when it is a network that you no longer use, remove the Wi-Fi network by the steps below:

1. Tap the **Settings** icon on the home screen and then tap **Wi-Fi** to access the Wi-Fi settings page.
2. On the Wi-Fi settings page, tap and hold the name of the network to forget.
A context menu then opens.
3. Tap **Forget network**.



Some Wi-Fi networks may periodically change their passwords to enhance the network security. When this occurs, you need to change the saved login credentials. To change the password, follow the steps above to access the context menu of the intended network. Then tap **Modify network** to make the changes.


4.5 Using the Bluetooth Feature

Bluetooth enables the wireless connection over a short distance about 8 meters. It is specified as a “wireless personal area network” (WPAN). The tablet PC is Bluetooth-capable to synchronize data with other Bluetooth-capable devices such as PCs, laptops, hands-free, headsets, printers, PDAs and cell phones.

Before the tablet PC can connect a Bluetooth device, it needs to pair with that device. Such “pairing” involves the authentication between them to justify their accesses to each other. Once they are paired, they stay paired unless they are unpaired.


4.5.1 Enabling Bluetooth and Pairing with Bluetooth Device

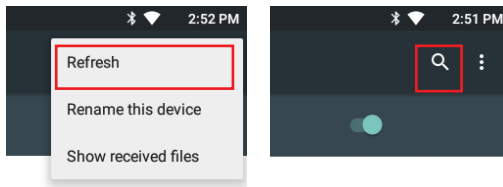
To enable or disable the Bluetooth function:

1. Tap the **Settings** icon on the home screen and then tap **Bluetooth** to access the Bluetooth settings page.
2. Switch on Bluetooth if it isn't enabled yet. The status bar displays the  icon when the Bluetooth function is enabled.

Note: While Bluetooth is enabled, the tablet PC is always visible to nearby devices. You cannot configure the visibility time but you can rename the tablet PC's name.

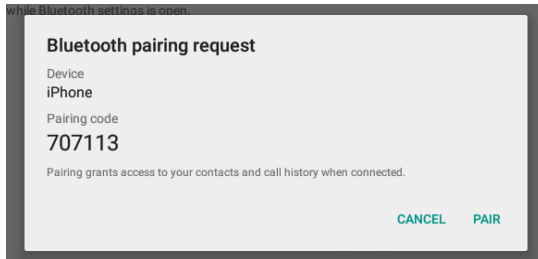
3. The tablet PC proceeds to scan for any Bluetooth device in range. Then it displays the names of the device(s) found.

If the Bluetooth device you want to pair with is not displayed in the **Available Devices** list, tap the menu icon  in the upper right corner to open the context menu and then tap **Refresh**. Or you can tap the search icon and then enter the name of the Bluetooth device you want to pair with.



Note: If the device to pair with isn't displayed after the scan, check if it is configured to be discoverable.

4. Tap the device you want to pair with. When the **Bluetooth pairing request** dialog box appears, tap **Pair**. The tablet PC will then send a connection request to the device you want to pair with.



On the device to pair with, a dialog box appears requesting to enter or verify the pairing code. The passkey entered or shown on the tablet PC and the Bluetooth device must be the same.


If you're prompted to enter a pin code, try entering 0000 or 1234 (the most common pin code), or look up in the documentation that came with the other Bluetooth device to learn its pin code.

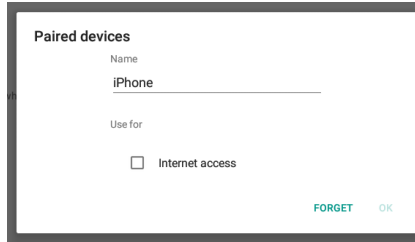
Then the devices proceed to pair with each other.

4.5.2 Configuring Bluetooth Features to Use

A "Bluetooth profile" defines the features supported by a Bluetooth device. For two Bluetooth devices to share files with each other, they need to both support the right profile. Some Bluetooth devices have multiple profiles. A profile can provide the ability to transmit phone conversations, to play music in stereo, or to transfer files or other data.


After you have paired a Bluetooth device with the tablet PC, you can select which profile you want to use with your tablet.

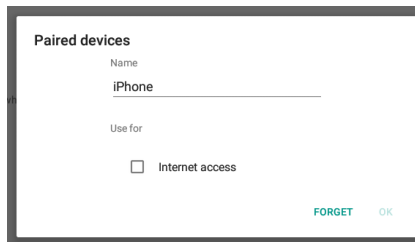
1. Tap the **Settings** icon on the home screen and then tap **Bluetooth** to access the Bluetooth settings page. Find the paired device that you want to configure the profiles and tap the  icon of the paired device.
2. A page opens for that paired device. Select or deselect a profile as needed.




4.5.3 Disconnect from a Bluetooth Device

To disconnect the tablet PC from a Bluetooth device:

1. Tap the **Settings** icon on the home screen and then tap **Bluetooth** to access the Bluetooth settings page.
2. Find the paired device that you want to disconnect and tap the  icon of the paired device.
3. A page opens for that paired device. Tap **Forget**.



4.5.4 Additional Bluetooth Settings

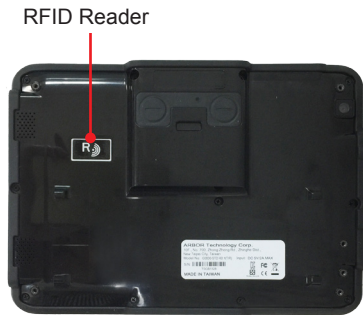
From the Bluetooth settings page, tap the menu icon  and a context menu opens providing the following options:

1. **Rename tablet:** Allows you to edit the Bluetooth name of the tablet PC that will be shown to others when they try to search for it.
2. **Show received files:** Open the location where downloaded and uploaded Bluetooth files are stored.

4.6 Using the RFID Feature (Optional)

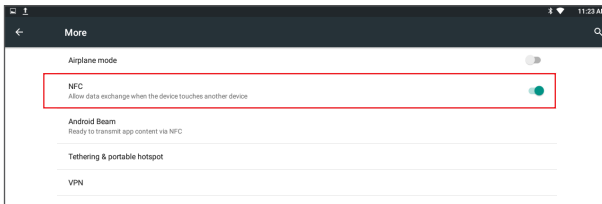

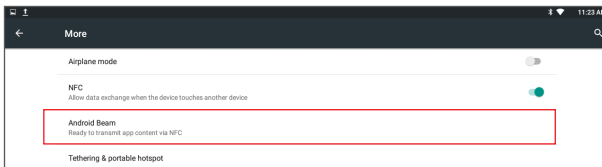
4.7.1 Using the Android Beam Feature

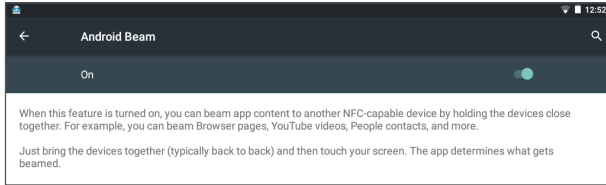
To use NFC to exchange App contents, both sending and receiving devices must be NFC-enabled and unlocked. The following is an example describing how to beam App content from the tablet PC to another NFC device:

1. Make sure both devices are NFC-enabled. To enable the tablet PC's NFC function, tap the **Settings** icon on the home screen and then tap **More** under the **Wireless & networks** section. Then enable the NFC function.



2. On the same page, tap Android Beam and then turn on the Android Beam feature.

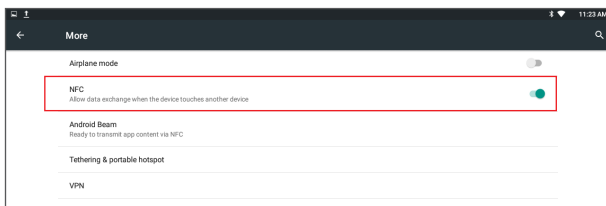




3. On the tablet PC, open the content you want to exchange.
4. Make sure the screen of both devices are unlocked, then hold your tablet PC and the receiving device back to back so that the NFC detection areas of both devices are within a range of about 4 centimeters.
5. On the tablet PC, you will hear a sound and be prompted a message “**Touch to beam**”. Touch the screen of the tablet PC to begin the beaming process.
6. The content will appear on the receiving device’s screen.

4.7.2 Using the Tap & Pay Feature

You can tap and pay with the tablet PC at the merchants that accept contactless payments. To use the tap & pay function, make sure you have enabled the tablet PC’s NFC function via **Settings > Wireless & networks > More > NFC**.

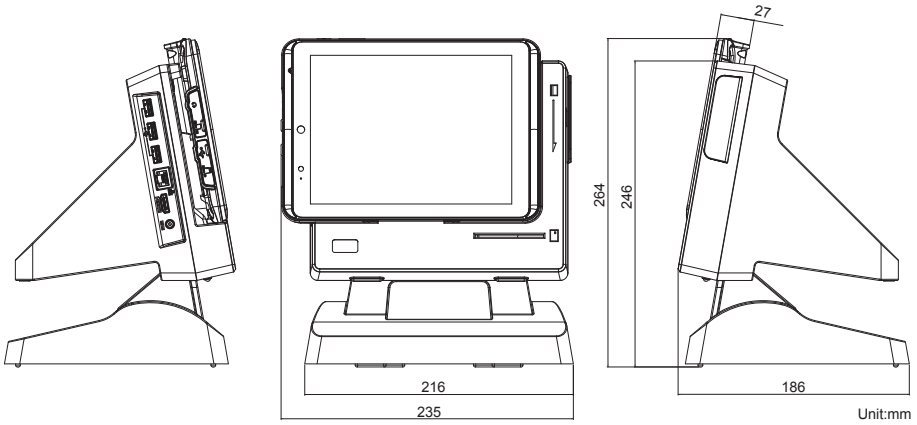
A. Using the Desktop Cradle (Optional)

A.1 Overview



Items	Descriptions
Pogo pin connector	22-pin connector for connection with tablet PC.
Smart card reader	Allows to insert a smart card to read the card data.
MSR	Magnetic Stripe Reader. To swipe a magnetic (MSR) card and read card data.
NFC reader	Tap a NFC card or hold the card against the surface to read the card data.
USB ports	3 x USB 2.0 Type-A ports. To connect to USB devices. For power delivery, the USB 2.0 ports can provide maximum 900mA of current as USB 3.0.
LAN port	Gigabit Ethernet port. To connect the computer to a network through an Ethernet cable.
HDMI port	HDMI output port. To connect to an HDMI input port of a display.
DC-In power jack	DC-IN Power jack. To connect the computer to a power source through provided AC power adapter.

A.3 Docking the Tablet PC to the Desktop Cradle

To dock the tablet PC:

1. With screen side facing out, insert the bottom of the tablet PC into the desktop cradle. Make sure to align with the guide posts on the cradle.



2. Connect the DC-IN jack on the cradle to a power source using the AC/DC power adapter (12V/60W AC/DC adapter kit).



When the cradle is connected to a power source, the docked tablet PC will charge through the cradle. When charging is in progress, the power LED is blinking in red.

Caution: When the tablet PC is docked in the cradle, do not connect the tablet PC and the cradle to power source at the same time to prevent damage to the products.

A.4 Using the Cradle Functions

A.4.1 Tilting the Tablet PC

The cradle allows you to tilt the tablet PC for optimized view angle. Just tilt the angle as required.

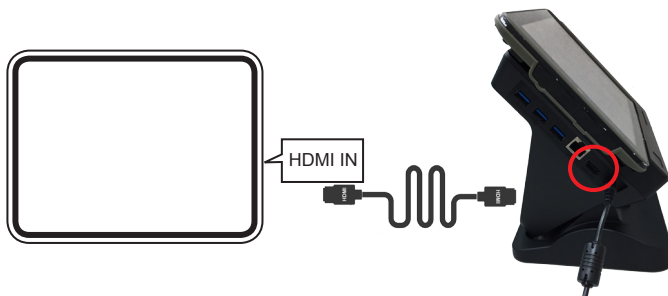


A.4.2 Connecting to an HDMI Display Monitor

The cradle comes with an HDMI connector supporting high resolution of up to 2K. It enables you to connect an external display monitor to your tablet PC to enjoy the benefits of larger screen. To connect the tablet PC to an external monitor:

1. Using an HDMI cable, connect one end to the HDMI port on the cradle.
2. Connect the other end of the HDMI cable to the HDMI IN port on the monitor.

After the connection, the screen will be automatically duplicated on the external monitor.



A.4.3 Connecting to a Local Area Network

The cradle comes with a LAN port allowing you to connect the tablet PC to a wired local area network. To connect the tablet PC to a wired network:

1. Using a Ethernet cable, connect one end to the LAN port on the cradle.
2. Connect the other end of the Ethernet cable to a hub, switch or router.



A.4.4 Using the Smart Card Feature

The cradle is equipped with a smart card reader that allow users to provide identification and information using a smart card. To use a smart card, insert the card with the golden chip facing upward as shown below:

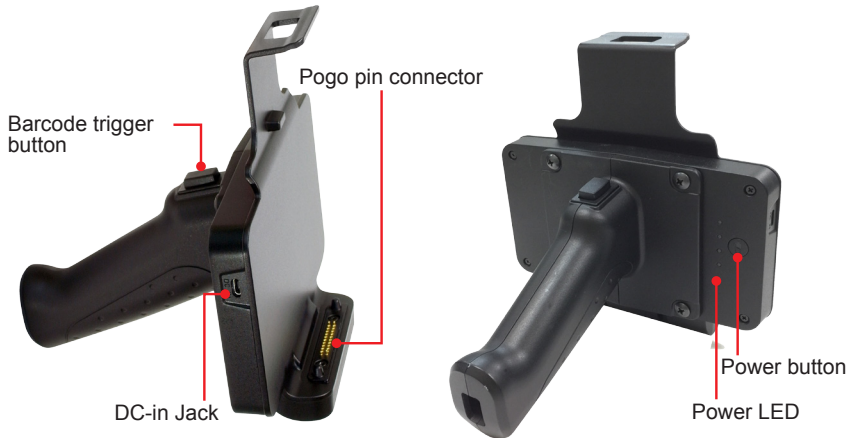


B. Using the Pistol Grip (Optional)

The optional pistol grip comes in two specifications: one with barcode button and power bank; the other with only barcode button. If your pistol grip is not equipped with the power bank, just ignore the related descriptions in this section.

B.1 Overview

B.1.1 Pistol Grip w/ Power Bank

Power button	Press the button to check the current battery level.

B.2 Docking the Tablet PC to the Pistol Grip

To dock the tablet PC:

1. With screen side facing out, insert the bottom of the tablet PC into the pistol grip. Make sure to align with the guide posts on the grip.



2. Push the top of the tablet PC firmly into the grip side.



B.3 Using the Pistol Grip's Barcode Trigger Function

1. Launch your barcode decoding application.
2. Point the scanner window at the barcode and press either of the barcode trigger buttons on the rear of the tablet PC. The scanner will project an aiming beam.



3. Upon a successful scan, the scan beam turns off. The decoded barcode data will be entered into your processing application.

B.4 Using the Pistol Grip's Power Bank Function

B.4.1 Charging the Tablet PC

To use the power bank to charge the tablet PC, just dock the tablet PC to the pistol grip. The power LED will show the charging level. If the LED doesn't light up, press the power button.



B.4.2 Charging the Power Bank

To charge the power bank:

1. Using the 5V/2A power adapter that comes with the tablet PC, connect the USB end to the USB port on the pistol grip.
2. Connect the power adapter to an electrical outlet.



*The power plug type of the provided power adapter varies according to region.

Caution: When the tablet PC is docked to the power pistol grip, do not connect the tablet PC and the pistol grip to power source at the same time to prevent damage to the products.
